



# *Proclamation*

## *In Recognition of*

### **Vietnam War Veterans Day**

**WHEREAS**, Vietnam War Veterans Day commemorates the sacrifices made by our nation's Vietnam veterans and their families; and

**WHEREAS**, it is a day that is part of a national effort to recognize the men and women who were denied a proper welcome upon returning home more than 50 years ago; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 29<sup>th</sup>, 1973 the last combat troops were withdrawn from Vietnam and the last prisoners of war held in North Vietnam arrived on American soil; and

**WHEREAS**, the President of the United States signed into law the Vietnam War Veterans Recognition Act of 2017, designating March 29<sup>th</sup> of each year National Vietnam War Veterans Day; and

**WHEREAS**, this day is to honor those who answered our nation's call of service—more than 58,000 names are memorialized on our nation's capitol grounds, 313 names are etched on the Vietnam War Memorial on the Hawai'i State Capitol grounds, and 1,253 heroes have yet to be returned to American soil; and

**WHEREAS**, the State of Hawai'i also recognizes the efforts of the 50<sup>th</sup> Commemoration of the Anniversary of the Vietnam War State Planning Committee chaired by COL Gene Castagnetti (USMC, Ret) who, with volunteers, many of whom were Vietnam-war veterans, met for over three years to plan a successful event; and

**WHEREAS**, our nation owes a great debt to those men, women, and family members who have sacrificed much for our nation's freedom;

**THEREFORE I, DAVID Y. IGE, Governor, and I, DOUGLAS S. CHIN, Lieutenant Governor of the State of Hawai'i,** do hereby proclaim March 29, 2018 as

in Hawai'i, and ask the people of the Aloha State to recognize those who honorably served our nation in the Vietnam War and recommit ourselves to supporting our troops in battle and upon their return home.
