- (4) To highlight the advances in technology, science, and medicine related to military research conducted during the Vietnam War
- (5) To recognize the contributions and sacrifices made by the allies of the United States during the Vietnam War.

The U.S. Senate has passed a resolution to make 30 March Vietnam Veterans Day. If the motion passes in the House, it will go to the President.

tions past conflicts. The highest priority of the organization is the return of any living Americans that remain prisoners of war. To date, the U.S. Government has not found any evidence that there are still American POWs in captivity from past U.S. conflicts.
