On August 4, the United States Coast Guard (USCG) rings in 234 years of service to our Nation. Thank you for your service Coast Guard service members, and happy birthday USCG!

In addition to the approximately *eight thousand* Coast Guard personnel who served in Southeast Asia during the Vietnam War, dozens of water vessels known as "cutters" were also assigned. The largest varied from 255 to 378 feet. Rush (WHEC-723) a 378-foot Hamilton class high endurance cutter, (at left), was named for our 8th U.S. Treasury Secretary, Richard Rush, and served as a naval gunfire support ship in the region, among other efforts. These sizable cutters supported multiple efforts, including amphibious assaults and the interdiction of enemy supply vessels. Vietnam veteran, retired U.S.
